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Tree

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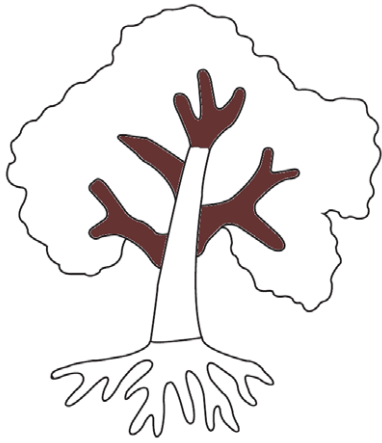
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A *tree*
is a plant that produces wood and
can grow very tall. It is made up
of roots, a trunk, branches, and
leaves.



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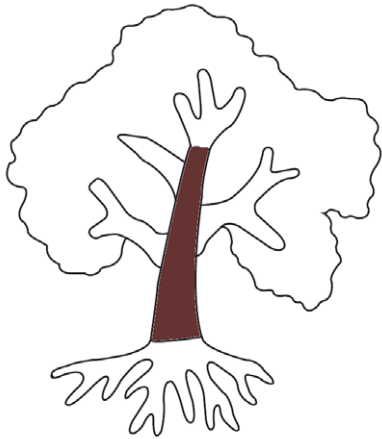


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The *branches*

grow from the trunk and support the leaves, flowers, and fruits. They also help spread the tree's canopy, capturing sunlight more efficiently.

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The *trunk*

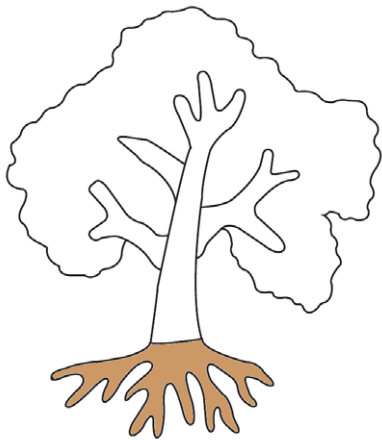
is the main woody part of the tree. It helps the tree reach the necessary height to receive sunlight. It connects the branches to the roots, providing structural support for the canopy.



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The **leaves**
grow on the branches. They have
veins and produce food for the tree
using sunlight.

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The **root**
is the part of the plant that is
underground. It absorbs water
and minerals to feed the tree and
keeps it firmly anchored in the
ground.

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
